Review Psalm 13

1. David's solid worship and allegiance to his God and King.

Psalm 145:1 I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless you *and praise your name forever and ever.* Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised, *and his greatness is unsearchable.*

2. Passing the praise of God from one generation to another.

Psalm 145:4 One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.

3. David emphasizes the blessing of God's kindness.

Psalm 145:8 The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

4. David praises God for His acts of deliverance.

Psalm 145:17 The Lord is righteous in all his ways and kind in all his works. 18 The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth.
