2 Samuel 12:10-14

I. Consequences Usually Reach Further than We Realize (v.10)

David's failure would have a lasting effect for his family and his nation.

II. Consequences are More Than Just the Physical (v.11 - 12)

David's shame would be laid before the entire nation.

III. Consequences are Beyond Our Control (v.13-14)

David could not undo what he had done, nor could he stop the consequences of his actions.

But we are not hopeless. Even as we endure the consequences of our sin,
God stands ready to forgive us and give us hope.
